“ I never planned on coming out to my lola, I loved her so much that I didn't want to disappoint her. There were a good amount of people who did not take well to my queerness. I genuinely thought I would give her a heart attack if she found out. I got a random call from her one day and she was like "are you living with your mom?" And I was like "No lola? Don't you live with mom?" And she was like "Yes! Who are you living with now?" And I was like "My...friend." And she was like "What is her name?" And I told her and she replied, "Is she your girlfriend?" And my heart dropped to my stomach and having been caught, I couldn't say anything smarter than "uhhhhhh" and she quickly cut in with "It's okay! As long as your happy! As long your happy!" I started laughing, and just kept repeating "Thank you lola" and "I love you lola" I visited her in the hospital shortly after that with my partner and she smiled her knowing smile and said "Is this your sweetheart?" And I laughed and was like "Yes lola." And she went on to talk about how good it was that we have each other and to take care of each other and that her only wish is my happiness and she told Ana, my partner, that she already loves her and that she's like another daughter to her. My lola, above anyone else accepted me wholly for who I am, she gave me hope and love and kindness and acceptance and my life will not be the same without her.

“ From the time I was really small my lola always told me the same story over and over. "When I was young, I was very beautiful." And then she would describe how small her waist was by putting her hands up and touching her fingertips together in an oval. Then she would continue, "I had 3 suitors, a business man, an actor, and a general. I chose the general!" Her stories always made me laugh or sit in awe of her and how much history she lived through. She also told me how during wartime as a child, her father had a gun factory and she would hide and transport guns to rebels in her balut basket. She was the strongest woman I've ever met. She was the ultimate matriarch of both our family in the Philippines and out here. She led us by example with her strength and grace. She raised me as a child while my parents both worked full-time plus. She never stifled or crushed me, she let me grow and become the strong and unique individual I am today. She always made sure I ate well and worried about all the oddest things, like when I went through a phase of wearing all the necklaces I owned all at once (I was maybe 8) she made sure I took them all off and gave them to her so I wouldn't choke. I once brought in a bird my dog accidentally killed and she thought that since I touched it I would get bird flu. But she never worried about me exploring or going outside for too long or walking to the corner store by myself or wearing my clothes in weird ways, she would laugh at my weirdness but never forced me to be any way I didn't want to be. I would not be the person I am today without her.
